



Visa to Aden

The visitor can get entry visa to the Aden from the Yemeni Embassy or Consulate in his/her country and payment of a minimal Consular fee.

Where Yemeni diplomatic missions don't exist, visitors may get a transit visa valid for 96 days with possibility to be renewed at the entrance port. Every official visitor to Aden receives, immediately upon arrival, a permit to stay one month. Within this period, you do not need to register with the police or to get a departure permit.

Holders of EEC passports & the G8 can now obtain entry visas at boarder of the airport. For countries

where Aden has no diplomatic representation, visas can be arranged locally. This service is usually available at travel agencies in Aden. Travelers to Aden require a passport that is valid for at least six months. Visas are valid for three months from the day of issuance

No airport tax on departure.

All travelers have not to pay an airport departure tax. This applies to Aden nationals and visa

Foreigners need to obtain an entry visa to visit Yemen. It can be gained from an embassy or a consulate of Yemen. At entry he/she is given a visa that is valid for three months. Visas are required for all visitors except nationals for Bahrain, Iraq, Egypt, Jordan, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria and UAE.
